CELEBRATING DIVERSITY WITH YOUNG CHILDREN

According to Harvard University psychologist and researcher Mahzarin Banaji, children as young as three may embrace and accept racism and prejudice when exposed to it, even though they might not understand the feelings. Exposure to diversity at an early age may buffer these influences, and children's books can help!

The crucial component necessary for children to embrace diversity is to observe different groups interacting as equals in balanced and positive ways. Exposure to diversity will emphasize that there are more important qualities that define someone other than the color of their skin, physical features, ethnicity, or gender (Burnett, 2012).
