
Annual Appeal Turkey Challenge

Celebrating Holidays at CCC

Holiday celebrations can be wonderful opportunities for children to learn about the traditions and values that are significant parts of people's lives. At Concord Children's Center it is important our curriculum reflects and respects the cultures represented by all of our families. Holidays are one way for our community to work together to create developmentally and culturally appropriate learning experiences.

Following the lead of our children and their families, CCC includes a variety of holidays in the curriculum and invites families to share special traditions. Our CCC community of families celebrate over two dozen different holidays

throughout the year. This Fall we celebrated Halloween and Diwali. We focus on the secular aspects of holidays, often celebrating commonalities of the various traditions.

In November we will have a Friendship Feast at West Concord and Ripley. Children look forward to these events, participate in preparing the food and are very excited to be sharing a meal with their whole school!

We recognize, regardless of which holidays are celebrated, they often come with an abundance of anticipation and excitement. We are all affected, no matter what our traditions may be. At the Children's Center, we remain committed to providing developmentally appropriate experiences, and paying careful attention to children's emotional and physical wellbeing. We provide a calm and predictable place for children, and guide conversations toward opportunities of giving vs. getting.



Technology for Your Teachers

As any organization, operating since 1975, CCC has seen a steady evolution of the tools we use to accomplish our mission. In the world of "technology tools" we have possibly been slower to move forward than the organizations where many of our families work.

Several years ago parents started donating laptops to the school. Teachers were able to more efficiently create conferences and portfolio

documentation using laptops and digital cameras. We gradually began to purchase used and refurbished laptops, keeping our budget dollars focused on our core mission. We are now looking to take a leap forward. We educate your children through play and the close relationship they have with their teachers. We also communicate with families through conversations and face to face interactions, again our emphasis is on relationships. While our non-technical interactions are our highest priority, we acknowledge the value of technology in enhancing communication with families and creating easier more "organic to the classroom" strategies for accessing curriculum material, documenting, and chronicling the learning process. We also

acknowledge the importance of having up to date technology that works smoothly in our non-technical environment. This Fall we will purchase three tablets for use by classroom teacher's. The value of the tablet is the dual role it can play as a camera, a laptop, and a connection to the internet. Our plan is to purchase or lease one tablet for each classroom once we are sure this tool works in our environment. The tablets are for the teachers. Teachers may use the Tablets to bring curriculum into the classroom, however they will not be used by children. This year's Annual

Appeal dollars will support this effort and we thank all of our families for participating in the Turkey Challenge!

The second standard in the NAEYC Accreditation Classroom Portfolio is "Curriculum".

Standard #2 Curriculum: The program implements a curriculum that is consistent with its goals for children and promotes learning and development in each of the following areas: social, emotional, physical, language, and cognitive. A well-planned written curriculum provides a guide for teachers and administrators. It helps them work together and balance different activities and approaches to maximize children's learning and development. The curriculum includes goals for the content that children are learning, planned activities linked to these goals, daily schedules and routines, and materials to be used.

Below are examples of the NAEYC Portfolio entries from 2012.

Standard 2.A. Criteria 12: The curriculum guides teachers to plan for children's engagement in play (including dramatic play and blocks) that is integrated into classroom topics of study.

When CCC teachers decide on a theme or area of exploration it can be explored in all areas of the classroom. The dramatic play area can be turned into a cave or a Post Office. Animals and clipboards with crayons are made available in the block area. Themes presented at circle time are explored in art activities, through special books and introduced as themes for dramatic play.



After reading Jann Brett's Gingerbread Baby, a group of children built and decorated their own Ginger bread house in the block area which integrated literature, blocks and community play.

The theme of post office was explored in the dramatic play area with costumes, letter writing materials, a plastic post office box replica and a visit from our local mail carrier. In addition, our class sent letter's to their grandparents asking them what they did when they were four to five years of age.
