CCC Board Priorities 2018-19

Building for CCC's Future

For our continuing families it is not news that CCC has been considering alternatives to house our Ripley and Emerson programs. We have occupied the Ripley classrooms since 1981 and the Emerson classrooms since 1986. These sites are leased from the Town and Emerson Hospital respectively. We love our Emerson and Ripley homes, with all of their benefits and challenges, not the least of which is the insecurity of leases that can vary from one year to the next. This year's Board Priorities lead with addressing this insecurity over the next several years. In September the Board adopted five areas of priority: Financial and Facility Planning, Community, Communication, Staff, and Technology. The key focus for the year is to develop a long term plan to ensure that CCC can continue to fulfill its mission and most effectively serve our families through site sustainability. Over the years the CCC Board has consistently worked to replenish our reserves, which were instrumental in financing the construction of 1300 Main Street, completed in 2002. Robust enrollment, a strong economy, and prudent financial stewardship have resulted in healthy reserves that could support a future building project.

The Board welcomes participation from all families and staff. Please join us at a Board meeting or consider joining a committee. Our November 14 Board meeting at 1300 Main Street will include a discussion of our long range planning process.



What are we doing now to prepare for the future of CCC?

While we continue negotiations for extended leases with our current landlords,

we are exploring alternative locations for Ripley and Emerson. Our Current leases will not expire until 2020 and 2021. This is an exciting time of exploration and visioning, one which also provides us with the opportunity to consider moving CCC to a two-site model by combining our Emerson and Ripley sites. Having our own buildings offer wonderful opportunities for designing our environment to best support children and learning.

The Board, its committees, and CCC Administration are planning now so that we are prepared. Having a plan is something we discuss with the children at CCC every day. For some it is about building a bridge with Magna Tiles, asking a child to play, or getting the snow pants on without too much trouble. For us, it is preparing for the future.

We will invite the entire community to participate in this process. Our Long Range Planning Committee is continuing last year's discussions of the best programmatic and facility models for sustaining CCC. The Finance Committee will be looking at the financial capacity of CCC to embark on a capital project, and the Development Committee will begin to look at how we raise the funds for a variety of scenarios. Staff will discuss ideal environments for delivering the best experiences for children, families, and teachers.

November 12 Professional Devlopment for CCC Staff Diversity and Cultural Competence: Dr. Jody Figuerido

Culturally competent educators have knowledge about ethnic and cultural diversity that enables them to provide culturally responsive programming for the children and families they serve. According to developmentally appropriate practice (NAEYC, 2009), educators should be culturally and socially responsive as well as respectful of the social and cultural context of the children in the program. The goal of this session is for participants to gain a broader perspective of cultural diversity; consider how it impacts experiences, beliefs, values, and practices; and implement culturally responsive approaches to support all children and families. This will be facilitated through reflection, sharing, and consideration of innovative strategies designed to support and is responsive to families and children of all cultures and ethnic backgrounds
