Community Events at CCC



CCC events are held to connect families with each other, their teachers, and the CCC Administration and Board. Below you will find a brief description of events that take place each year.

- **Picnics and Pot Lucks:** These are for the whole family, they are informal, and a wonderful time to connect with other families and the teachers.
- **Classroom Events:** Information about classroom events can be found in your parent mailbox that is located in your child's classroom. CCC teachers also email notices of up-coming events. Classroom events include morning coffees, afternoon pizza parties, plays, and art shows.
- **Fall Social:** A very festive adult event is held at the home of one of our families.




Communicating What We Do and Why




Every year families learn about their children's time at CCC through conversations with their children, their teachers, other parents, and their children's friends. We meet face to face at drop off and pick-up, at pizza parties and "Back To School Nights", formally at conferences, and much



less formally at the Fall Social and Spring Auction. Walking into school, families have the opportunity to see children's work on the walls as well as photographs of what is happening in the classroom. Sharing with our families and with each other what our children are learning, how and why, is key to successful early childhood experiences.



Teachers observe and document daily the experiences of children in their care. These observations and documentation form the basis for planning curriculum in the classroom and assuring an experience that meets the needs of each child. We use a tool, **Kaymbu**, to record, document, and share observations. **Kaymbu** provides a vehicle for teacher reflection, and allows us to communicate these reflections to families through email.



Our face to face communication will remain our most important way of being in touch with our families and building the family/school relationships.



In order to be sure you receive updates from your classroom, please remember to send email address changes to Candice at office@concordchildrenscenter.org. For families wishing to download the free Kaymbu App:

1. Search for "Kaymbu for Parents" in the App Store (iPhone) or Google Play (Android phones)
2. Download the app
3. Enter the email or phone number connected to your child's profile
4. A four digit pin will be sent to the email or phone number you entered
5. Enter the four digit pin to finish logging in!

Staying on top of what's happening at CCC

CCC Communication with families:

Concord Children's Center approach to communicating with families is integral to our commitment to work in partnership with our families and foster a strong community. First and foremost, we value face to face or telephone conversations between families, educators, and administrators. Regular communication among parents and teachers is of enormous benefit to each child. We want to know about events at home, which will affect a child's day with us, and we will let parents know of their child's adjustment and progress, and of events at the center. Families are invited to drop by their child's classroom or phone teachers or program directors during the day with questions. Longer conversations may be scheduled for a mutually convenient time. Conferences are scheduled throughout the year.

CCC uses email, Facebook, and our Kaymbu App to communicate classroom happenings, CCC news, and notices of upcoming events.

- **CCC Email:** When families enroll at CCC we request preferred email addresses for our use. Emails are sent via Google Groups. We rely on parents to let us know if their email address changes. Changes can be sent to the office@concordchildrenscenter.org.
- **CCC Facebook Page.** Families can follow us at: www.facebook.com/concordchildrenscenter We post photos of CCC events as well as announcements of upcoming events and anticipated school closings.

- **Kaymbu:** Throughout the year families will receive Kaymbu communication via email or through the Kaymbu App (<https://help.kaymbu.com/hc/en-us/articles/115004757893--Kaymbu-for-Parents-App-Launch>) . Teachers use Kaymbu to share classroom curriculum and news.
- **Text Messages for emergencies or school closings.** In the Fall of 2018 we will have the capacity to send text messages to families who have provided cell phone numbers. Texts will be limited to school closings or emergencies.

August 2018 Professional Development Day

The Wonder of Learning—The Hundred Languages of Children

On Monday August 20, the CCC Staff will travel to Brookline for a day at the Wonder of Learning. Hosted by Boston University/Wheelock College, The Wonder of Learning includes a 7000 sq. ft. multimedia traveling exhibition, developed by Reggio Children and coordinated by the North American Reggio Emilia Alliance (NAREA), that visually presents the Reggio Emilia approach to early childhood education. Using images and text, interactive multimedia, handmade artifacts, and publications, the exhibition explores how teachers and students work together to construct knowledge around compelling projects. Through the exhibition, educators encounter some of the most effective approaches to teaching. Since its debut in 2008, more than 120,000 people have encountered The Wonder of Learning and experienced a variety of professional development initiatives aimed at advancing knowledge and action for early childhood. In the afternoon staff will explore “the role of the environment” in early childhood settings. A thoughtfully arranged classroom is as important as a well-trained teacher and can be one of our biggest allies. When challenges arise in our programs, it is always important to consider how changes within a space can be of support. In this interactive session, our teachers will review the importance of the environment’s role, reflect on a few examples of how challenges in spaces were addressed, uncover ways to enhance space, and reflect on key elements like color, texture, lighting, and elements of the natural world. This session will be led by Hilary O’day, Director of the Newtowne School. Hilary brings over 20 years of extensive experience building model early childhood programs, specifically with the Reggio Emilia approach in mind. She believes wholeheartedly that a child’s learning experience relies on the presence of three major educators: the adult (both parents and teachers), the environment, and a child’s peers. Her school and work have become a destination for visitors from around the world and her workshops for practitioners inspire. She has been recognized by colleagues and researchers for her exceptional understanding of how to create optimal learning environments and develop documentation that shows children as capable and truly makes learning visible.

The remainder of our August Work Week will be spent preparing classrooms and planning for the 2018-19 school year.
