
Concord Children's Center Mission Statement

Fiscal Year 2019 Operating Expenses






2018-2019 CCC Snapshot

During the 2018-2019 school year, CCC served 233 children from 171 families from 18 towns. Almost 80 percent of our families came from Concord. Thanks to the generosity of the Concord-Carlisle Community Chest, the Trinitarian Congregational Church, and the state voucher program, we were able to offer tuition assistance to 11 percent of our families.

Book Shop Fundraiser

Our annual fundraiser at the Concord Bookshop, a day when the Bookshop donates a portion of the day's proceeds back to CCC, took place on October 27, 2018. The theme of the day was "Let Nature Be Your Teacher." The event was well-attended and raised \$852.20.

Family Ice Skating Party

This year's family ice skating party took place on Sunday, February 10, at Nashoba Valley Olympia. The theme of the party was "Wonderland on Ice" and featured appearances from Alice, the White Rabbit, and the Mad Hatter. The afternoon raised \$1,900.

Auction

The 2019 CCC Auction with the theme of "Through the Looking Glass," was held on March 30, at Tri-Con. The evening raised **\$28,897**. Around 135 people attended the event, which was led by auction co-chairs Lindsey Dempsey and Katherine Wilson.

Donor Profile

David Holdorf and Kathy Dwyer

David and Kathy are inaugural members of the Friendship Circle. They moved to Concord in 1981, when their daughter, Lise, was 1, and Kathy was expecting their son, Jon. Both Kathy and David worked in Boston, Kathy for IBM and David as an architect. Initially they brought someone into their home to take care of the children, but as time passed, David and Kathy realized that their children needed the stimulation of other children.

CCC was just a few years old in 1982, but David and Kathy enrolled their children, mainly because many of the kids in their neighborhood also attended. There were other day care centers in Concord, but CCC in its Harvey Wheeler location seemed like a great fit for their family needs. They knew they had made the right choice when they saw how their shy son loved CCC – his teachers, Flo and Leslie, knew how to work with his shyness.

A Conversation with David and Kathy:

For your family, what makes CCC a special place?

Buildings only bear a peripheral relationship to learning and socialization. The real strength of an institution like CCC is its staff and their relationship to the children.

Why do you give to CCC?

The strength of any community is fundamentally its schools. Our public schools are great, but it all starts much sooner than that. We give to our public schools thru our taxes and volunteer work, but there is no such structure for supporting day care and younger children. Such support has to come from tuition and private donations. But tuition alone cannot do the trick, because if it could, the tuition costs would become unaffordable for many parents. We consider supporting CCC as supporting local education in general. Both Lisa and Jon live in Concord now, and thus we have a vested interest in the entire spectrum of local education.

What changes have you seen at CCC since first becoming part of the community?

I suppose the logical answer is the new building (now middle-aged). It's nice and works beautifully, but again, the strength of an institution like CCC is its staff. We recently went to an event at CCC which included fairly loud music. I watched our 2 year old granddaughter shying away from the music, and watched a teacher who saw the same thing just grab her and rub her back for the half-hour program. Wish I had taken a picture.



2018-2019 Concord Children's Center Fund for CCC Supporters


