The Importance of Play for Young Children

"It's great that the kids play so much at CCC, but when do they *learn*?"

This is a question we receive from time to time at CCC from parents and caregivers. The answer we give them?

For children, play *is* the best type of learning.

At CCC, we believe that the best preparation for a child's development and future learning is open-ended, child-initiated play. Throughout the day our teachers guide children through creating new learning experiences through their play, building the foundations for children's confidence in themselves, the development of meaningful relationships, and a curiosity about learning.

And play is serious business when it comes to young children's learning and development. According to the <u>American Academy of Pediatrics</u>, "play is not frivolous: it enhances brain structure and function and promotes executive function (the process of learning, rather than the content), which allow us to pursue goals and ignore distractions."

Play is key to building strong brains, bodies, and social bonds. It improves children's abilities to plan, organize, get along with others, and regulate emotions. It helps with language, math, social skills, and even stress management. Giving children plenty of opportunities to play is one of the best ways to help them grow into curious, creative, healthy and happy adults equipped with the skills they need to be lifelong learners. Play taps into the natural ways we learn, to nurture capable, confident children who become adults ready to take on the world.

The <u>Harvard Graduate School of Education</u> identifies three indicators of children engaging in playful learning (do any of them remind you of a CCC classroom?):

1. Choice: children setting goals, developing and sharing







- ideas, making rules, negotiating challenges, and choosing how long to play.
- 2. <u>Wonder</u>: children exploring, creating, pretending, imagining, and learning from trial and error.
- 3. <u>Delight</u>: happiness! Children smiling, laughing, being silly, or generally feeling cozy and at ease.

There are many resources addressing the importance of play for children -- a <u>representative collection</u> is provided on the CCC website. Parents who would like more information on this topic or who have questions are encouraged to speak with your program director.
