Welcome to the 22-23 School Year



Dear CCC Families and Teachers,

We are off to a great, "normal" start to the new school year. Most of our COVID protocols have been lifted (although we are prepared to pivot in this regard if needed), and I am so enjoying seeing the faces and smiles of our children and teachers. It is wonderful to be able to again welcome our families in to our buildings and see their happiness at being able to see their child's school and classroom, in many cases for the first time.

We start the new school year with several staff changes. Former Ripley program director **Penni Hensley Wagner** has taken over as Administrative Director from **Joanne Saideh**, who is now our Director of Professional Learning. Former Ripley assistant program director **Emily**

D'Arcy has stepped into the program director role and Ripley teacher **Brinna Conley** into the assistant program director role (by the way, both Emily and Brinna are past CCC students themselves!). From its founding in 1975, CCC has prioritized providing its teachers with opportunities to continue to learn and grow in their profession, with the result that we enjoy an average teacher tenure of roughly 11 years.

Learning About the History of CCC: "We Need to Know Our History to Know Ourselves"

Every August during work week, the CCC staff takes one

morning for an all-staff meeting, where they receive updates for the school year and participate in cross-site professional development activities. This year's meeting took place on August 22 at the **Concord Public Library** (thank you to the library for donating their beautiful Goodwin Forum to us for the morning) and featured a special guest: CCC co-founder **Chris Gerzon**. CCC Executive Director Pat Nelson invited Chris to speak to the staff on the history of CCC, a request to which Chris readily agreed, since, as she pointed out to the staff, "we need to know our history to know ourselves."

Chris spoke about the early days of CCC when she and cofounder **Deborah Begner** started CCC with "no money, 5 teachers and 20 families who entrusted their children to us." And the values that Chris and Deborah held central to the founding of CCC remain at the heart of our program today (see sidebar, below).

Chris pointed out that, over the past 47 years, CCC has touched the lives of literally thousands of families and that the teachers are at the center of these relationships.

"You are CCC," Chris reminded the teachers and staff. "You are the heart and center of this school, and without your energy and commitment, there would be no CCC ... remember every day how vital your job is not only at the center for the children in your class and their parents but to our country and to its future. You are educating the next generation of people who will have to make some very serious decisions about the direction of this country and the fate of the world."

Chris wrapped up her presentation with good wishes to the teachers for the school year: "Congratulations on choosing the most important job in the world. May you spend many rewarding hours with these little ones who will certainly become more creative, competent, and caring people because of your influence."

47 Years of Concord Children's Center Values

- The teacher is not the expert imparting knowledge to parents, and listening to parental concerns means first understanding before offering advice.
- The most important thing to say to parents every day: remind them how much you love being with their child.
- How we talk to children matters. They will imitate you, what you say, and what you do, and they
 listen to everything
- How you arrange your classroom, your schedule and your materials influence how your children play. The most important aspect is to encourage exploration and all kinds of play with concrete objects and basic classic toys like blocks, puzzles, paint, and art supplies.
- Often less is more and simply being out in nature and with others can be the best teacher.
- Create a sense of community in your classroom based on trust. Children do not learn anything if they do not feel safe. Your primary job to make sure they feel safe.
- Your classroom is your students' first experience of what it means to be a member of a
 community, including learning that they have rights and responsibilities here, that conflicts are a
 natural and normal part of living with other people, and that learning to solve conflicts is a
 lifelong skill.

This is the start of an exciting year for CCC as we officially launch *CCC Reimagined*, our strategic project to best and more efficiently serve our children and families by restructuring to a two-site model. When this project is complete, CCC will own two sites in Concord, one at **1300 Main Street** on the west side of town and one at **250 Old Bedford Road** on the east side of town.

Construction on our new site at 250 Old Bedford Road is scheduled to start later this month, and we just held our first pre-construction meeting with the Town of Concord. We will be celebrating groundbreaking on our new site with a community celebration on **Sunday**, **October 16** -- see more details below.
